Committee Presents Petition

Save Dixie committee members plan to present a petition to keep "Dixie" as a school song to University president David W. Mullins this morning.

The petition was circulated for about a week in some living groups and among faculty members. Although an accurate count is not available now, a spokesman

for the group estimated there would be 2000 signatures on the petition.

Steve Bennett, a member of the independent organized committee, said the group was formed in response to action taken by the Southern Students' Organizing Committee to ban "Dixie."

papers that there was definite action being taken to ban "Dixie" through administrative channels," Bennett said. "If there is to be a decision made on "Dixie," I think students should make the decision," he added.
